Property Guardians: A Definition

- No statutory definition
- Guardians are residents who provide a measure of security for vacant properties



Property Guardians: Tenant or Licensee?

- The commercial nature of the arrangements depends upon the agreement being a licence *Camelot Garden Management Ltd v Khoo* [2018] EWHC 2296 (QB)
- Exclusive possession? Street v Mountford [1985] AC 809
- Not a tenant or licensee but a personal contract Oxley v Live in Guardians Limited

Can Property Guardians be Evicted?

- Is the guardian a tenant? Usual rules apply
- Is the guardian a licensee? Protection from Eviction Act 1977 applies
- Who evicts (i.e. who is the claimant in the possession claim)?
- That depends: who is the landlord / licensor?



Can Property Guardians make Disrepair Claims?

- Is the guardian a tenant? Usual rules apply
- Is the guardian a licensee? Very limited disrepair rights (not s11, or any associated legal protections)
- In theory, could be contractual rights but unlikely
- May be other (non-L&T) duties

Is the building an HMO? Probably...

- Occupied by 5 or more people, in 2 or more separate households
- Some or all of those people share bathroom, toilet or kitchen facilities
- At least one person pays for their occupation
- Living accommodation is not used for any other purpose
