Fees

In many cases we can agree a fixed fee arrangement with you, which means that we will charge you a set amount of money for a particular piece of work.

Below we provide estimates based on the ranges of fixed fees for barristers at 42 Bedford Row. All fees include VAT (where applicable).

If we charge fixed fees, these may vary depending on your needs – for example, your fees may be towards the higher end of the range if you need a more experienced barrister and/or you have a more complex case.

If you have a particularly complex case, your fees may also be higher than the estimates below.

There may also be additional costs for example you might have to pay a fee if you go to a court or tribunal in England or Wales.

These fees are different from the costs of instructing a barrister. You can find more information on court and tribunal fees here:

Stage of case	Ranges of fixed fees (estimates)
Written advice on your claim	£750 - £4,000
Preparation of a case, including meetings with you and assistance with drafting of any tribunal documents	£1,250 - £6,000
Preliminary hearing	£850 - £6,000
First day's tribunal appearance (1-2 day hearing only)	£1,750 - £8,500
Tribunal appearances per day, after the first day	£1,000 - £4,000
Remedy hearing (to decide compensation)	£1,750 - £6,000

Timescales

Timescales for your case may vary depending on factors such as barristers' availability, the complexity of your case, the need for additional documents and the other side's approach.

Although it's difficult to generalise, cases that only need one day for a hearing tend to have a hearing date between four to six months after a claim is made.

Some cases, like discrimination claims, will need longer than one day, so there may be a longer wait for a hearing.
